# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

#### The Dog Days of Summer

While July slipped past us and the August heat bears down on us, the season is changing just a little. Last night I arrived at my house after dark because I was finishing work on some outdoor irrigation projects and was surprised that the nightly news had not started yet. Ever so slightly the days are getting a little shorter and this brings the promise of fall days, cooler weather, and steelhead fishing.

Before we just jump to that point, there are several things to attract our attention. There are some last minute trips to the river and lake to squeeze in before school starts, a management plan for Lake Lowell should be released any day that will need comment and review, and maybe a run to Hells Canyon. One might wait for cooler weather for Hells Canyon however there are permits available on short notice for the wild and scenic portion and the scenic portion of the river. The WWA web site can direct anyone to the contact sites for those permits. Keep in mind that there are some great bass and trout fishing opportunities in the canyon in early September.

As for Lake Lowell, stay tuned. The management plan has been delayed and as soon as it is available for review we will post it to the web site with a link to obtain a pdf copy of the plan. I am guessing a pdf copy will save paper for all. Also as soon as possible, we will have a guest presenter at our membership meeting to go over the plan and field questions on the same.

Management of natural resources is essential to keep what we have available for multiple use. Last month I traveled to Winnemucca and the Long Draw fire impact is very apparent along the Highway 95 route. Most of the area burned so hot that any sagebrush remaining is a stump of four or five inches tall. That burn is several hundred thousand acres and, based on some pictures a BLM employee shared with me, is clearly visible from the space station.

With some re-seeding and management, the same employee shared that the area will appear renewed in perhaps three years. The unmeasured damage to that eco-system will be significant but affect the Sage Grouse population in that area and also the loss of cattle that were grazing in the area as well as other aspects. The fire moved over 30 miles per hour at one point and several hundred cattle were overtaken by the fire and destroyed or injured to the point they had to be destroyed.

Not that a management plan could prevent this damage but, proper input and planning within a management plan can minimize the effects of this type of event while preserving the

multiple use aspect of any ecosystem. As the Lake Lowell plan becomes available I would encourage all to review it and become informed of the proposed management plan. We all need to be diligent in the stewardship of our natural resources. Beyond economics, the availability of our natural resources is probably the most weighted reason most of us live in the Treasure Valley. Whether it is fishing, hunting, lake cruising, or whitewater that you enjoy, live the Dog Days of Summer and remember, there is no snow that you have to shovel from the walkway or driveway at least in the foreseeable future. Most of all, take part in the management of these resources in any way you can.
