# Salmon River Weed Run

For over ten years, in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service, the Idaho Department of Agriculture, and private property owners, WWA members provide transportation up the Salmon River and manpower to help control noxious weeds within the Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness.

This year, the "Weed Run" was held on June 15, 16 and 17 after being rescheduled from the first of May, because of high water. We had 6 boats and 18 volunteers to help spray weeds. The river was running at around 32,000 cfs – Chittam Rapid is huge at that level. Several of the boats were able to find the "Green Room" on the way back down.

The group provided noxious weed control at several locations this year including the Mackey Bar, Indian Creek and James Ranch. We stayed at the Mackav Bar this year. This project requires a significant amount of physical labor, as the weed control methods primarily entail hand application of chemical sprays and some hand pulling with much of the work taking place on steep terrain. Again this year, spray materials, boat fuel and food expenses are being covered by government grants and the WWA.

Jim McGarvin and Rich Vaughn cooked the meals and entertained the group. Don and Andrea Betzold, the owners of Mackay Bar were great hosts this year and provided their kitchen for cooking.

Everyone had a great time and we killed a lot of weeds. I would like to thank everyone that participated this year – this project gives the club a lot of good visibility with the government entities and private land owners.


