SKILLS DAY 2015

The 2015 Skills Day Run will be held on Saturday May 16, 2015. We will launch from the Hells Canyon Dam boat For those that ramp. never launched have from the dam, surprisingly there are several members that have not, the boat ramp is on the Oregon side. The ramp is easily accessed after crossing the dam.

There are a couple of things to be aware of in Hells Canyon. First, each boat must have a porta-potty on board. This is a part of preserving our Wild and Scenic river way. Next, keep in mind the two most common health issues that require medical attention for campers in Hells Canyon are spider bites and poison ivy. So don't bite any spiders unless you are on a first name basis and certainly don't try to poison Ivy unless you are on a first name basis with her as well. Lastly, make sure your equipment including CB radio are in top working condition. This is not a place to "work out the kinks".

Personally, I will be headed to the canyon early Friday for some fishing and plan to camp at Idaho Power's Hell Canyon Reservoir campground. The fee there is \$18.00 per night for RV's and \$10.00 per night for tents. There are no reservations taken for any of the Idaho Power campgrounds so it is first come first served. At Hells Canvon Reservoir campground there is overflow parking and camping near the boat dock and not to jinx anyone but, I have never seen the park and the overflow completely full except
