


NEW YEAR'S DAY RUN


group. It is appreciated that he is willing to give of his time to continue the work of promoting the fair and equitable access to rivers for all users.

Finally, the mechanic in me just has to put in this one little bit of technical advice. If you are towing your boat this winter over roads that have been treated with magnesium chloride it is a good idea to wash it off your boat as soon as possible. It is very corrosive to aluminum hulls.
